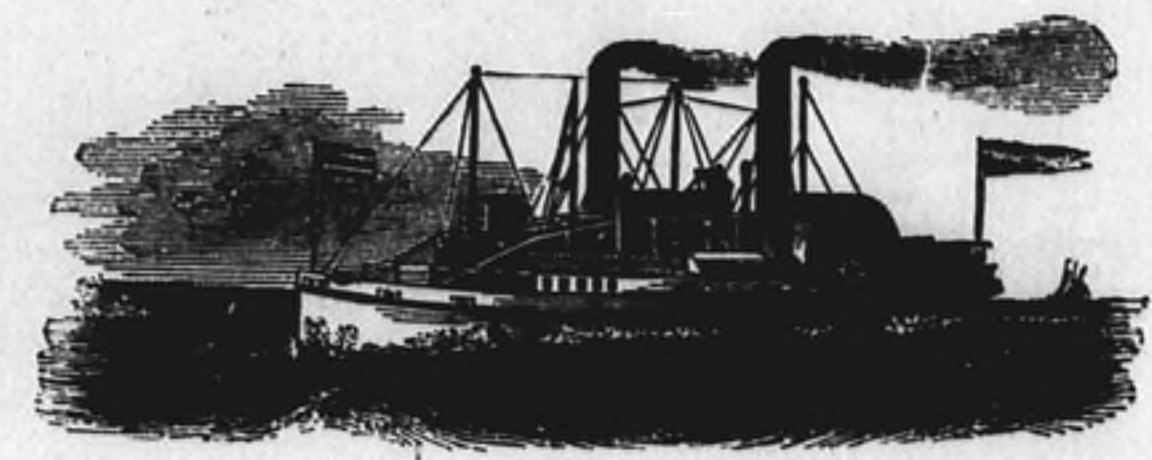

In Conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels, &c." passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, North-eastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1831, and "An Act to Provide for the better security of the Lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838, and the Act of August 30th, 1852, amending the same; also an Act entitled "An Act to provide for Recording the Conveyances of Vessels and for other purposes," passed July 29th, 1850, and Act of May 6th 1864.

is at present Master; and as he has sworn Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Milan State of Ohio in the year 1856, as appears by the Certificate of her last Enrollment at this Port, dated April 8th 1863, and numbered 54, now surrendered having been remeasured under Act of May 6th 1864.

And Sanford Hulbert surveyor having certified that the said Schooner or vessel has one deck and two masts and that her length is 122 1/2 feet inches her breadth 25 1/2 feet inches her depth 10 1/2 feet inches and that she measures two hundred and twenty two tons She ninety five that she is a Schooner has a square stern head.

And the said Joseph C. Strap and no figure having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at the PORT OF BUFFALO, N. Y.
