

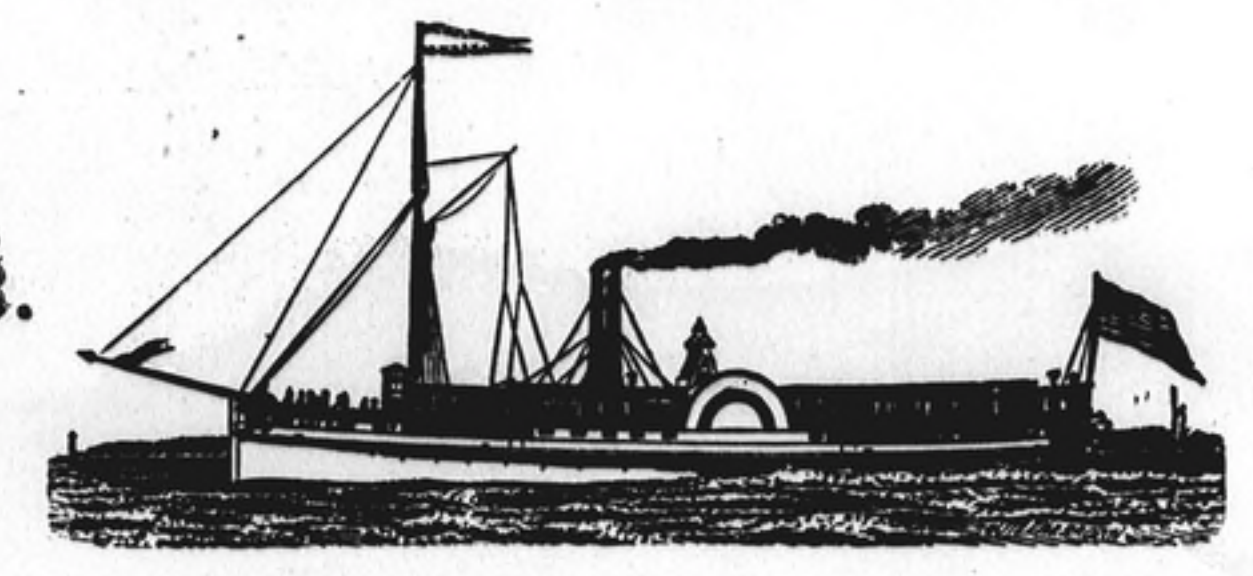

In Conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels, &c.," passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1821, and "An Act to Provide for the better security of the Lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838, and the Act of August 30th, 1852, amending the same, also an Act entitled "An Act to provide for Recording the Conveyances of Vessels, and for other purposes," passed July 20th, 1850, the 17th June, 1864, and the Acts of the 7th July, 1838, 29th July, 1850, and 6th May, 1864.

Johnson surveyor at Cleveland having certified that the said Schooner or vessel has one deck and two masts and that her length is 120 feet 2/10 inches Capacity under tonnage deck 191.54 her breadth 25 feet 10 inches Capacity of enclosures on upper deck 17.99 her depth 9 feet 7/10 inches and that she measures 209 tons 53/100 and that she is a Schooner has a Square stern and scroll head.

And the said Henry C Winslow having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at the PORT OF BUFFALO, N. Y.
