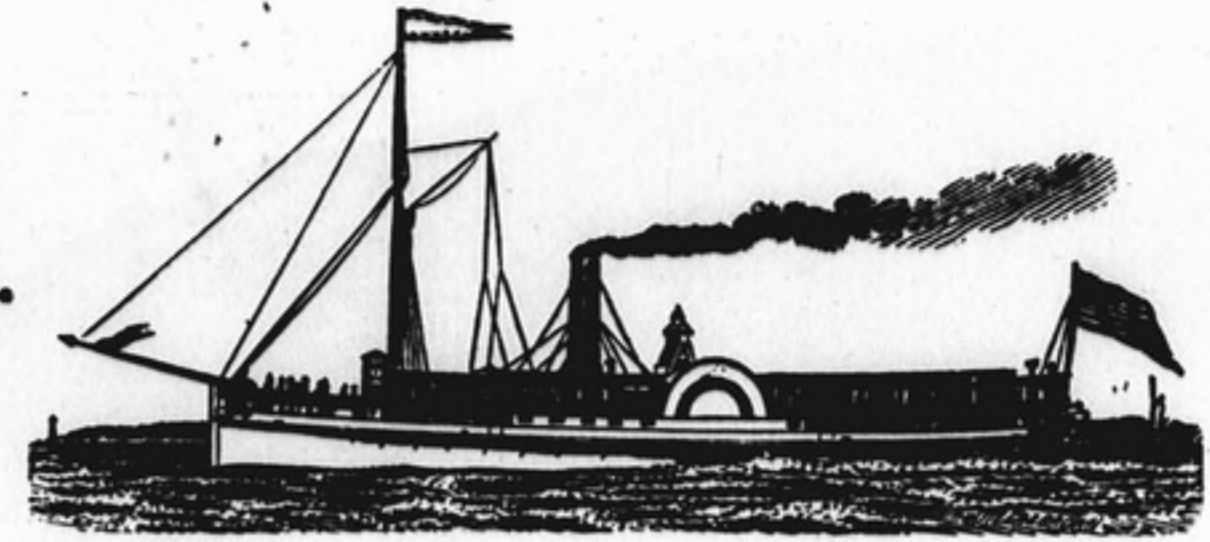

In Conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels, &c.," passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 23, 1831, and "An Act to provide for the better security of the Lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838, and the Act of August 30th, 1852, amending the same, also an Act entitled "An Act to provide for Recording the Conveyances of Vessels, and for other purposes," passed July 29th, 1850, the 17 June 1864 & the acts of the 7 July 1838 '29

July 1850 & 6 May 1864. John B. Griffin
having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he resides at Buffalo N.Y. and owns two thirds (2/3), and that Charles C. McDonald resides at the same place and owns one third (1/3), and that they are

of Buffalo whereof F. E. Bateman
is at present Master; and as he has sworn Schooner is a
Citizen of the United States, and that the said ship or Vessel was built at Buffalo N.Y.
State of in the year 1857, as appears by the Certificate of her last Enrollment
at this Port, dated April 22, 1865 and numbered 49, now surrendered,
having Head Room added.

And A. H. Sciroen surveyor having certified that
the said Schooner or vessel has one deck and three masts and that
her length is 137 5/10 feet Capacity under tonnage decks 307.02
her breadth 30 feet Capacity of enclosures on upper decks 33.47
her depth 11 feet 342.49
and that she measures 342 tons & 49 hundredths ninety-fifths
that she is a Schooner has a square stern
and no figure and head.

And the said John B. Griffin
agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the
said acts, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at the PORT OF BUFFALO, N. Y.
