

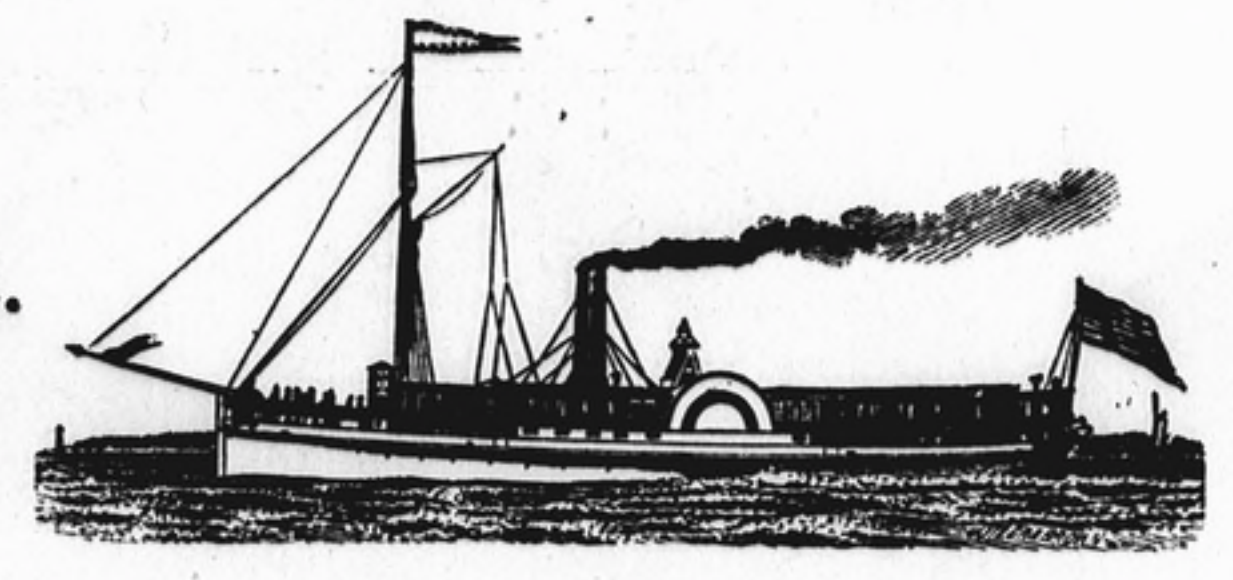

In Conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels, &c.," passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 23, 1801, and "An Act to provide for the better security of the Lives of Passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838, and the Act of August 30th, 1852 amending the same; also an Act entitled "An Act to provide for Recording the Certificates of Vessels, and for other purposes," passed July 20th, 1850. 29 July 1850 & 6th May 1864. The 17th June 1864 & the Act of the 7 July 1838

Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Buffalo N.Y. State of New York in the year 1861, as appears by the Certificate of her last Enrollment at this Port dated April 28 1865, and numbered 73, now surrendered, having Stead Room added

And Ira Barnard Jr Surveyor having certified that the said Schooner or vessel has one deck and two masts and that her length is 119 1/10 feet inches Capacity under tonnage decks 214.70 her breadth 25 9/10 feet inches Capacity of enclosures on upper decks 8.82 her depth 10 25/100 feet inches 223 tons & 52/100 ninety-fifths and that she measures 223 tons & 52/100 ninety-fifths that she is a Schooner has a square stern and no figure head.

And the said James C. Harrison having agreed to the description and measurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at the PORT OF BUFFALO, N. Y.
