In Conformity, to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for enrolling and Licensing Ships or Vessels, &c." passed the 18th Feb. 1793, and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 17th June, 1864, and the Acts of the 7th July, 1838, 29th July, 1850, and 6th May, 1864.

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he resides at Buffalo, N.Y. and that he is a

sole owner of the Brig or vessel called the William Treat of Buffalo whereof Jm Gain is at present Master, and as he hath sworn is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Brig or vessel was built at Euclid, Ohio in the year 1856, as appears by her last Enrollment at this Port, dated March 31st 1866, numbered 38, now surrendered having changed

And said Enrollment having certified that the said Brig or vessel has on deck and two masts, and that her length is 146 feet, her breadth 35 feet, her depth 11 feet, her height {389} feet, and that she measures 389 tons and 97 hundredths,
