In Conformity, to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for enrolling and Licensing Ships or Vessels, &c." passed the 18th Feb. 1793, and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 17th June, 1864, and the Acts of the 7th July, 1838, 29th July, 1850, and 6th May, 1864.

Parson of Buffalo whereof Justus Van Camp is at present Master, and as he hath sworn is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Sugg Prop. or vessel was built at Buffalo, N. Y. in the year 1866, as appears by the Certificate of C. A. Van Slyke, Shipwright her builder, dated July 19, 1866, on file in this Office.

And A. H. Scriven, Surveyor, having certified that the said Sugg Propeller or vessel has one deck and no mast, and that her length is 66 feet, her breadth 15 feet, her depth 8 feet, her height 10 feet, and that she measures 44 tons and 91 hundredths,
