In Conformity, to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for enrolling and Licensing Ships or Vessels, &c." passed the 18th Feb. 1793, and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 17th June, 1864, and the Acts of the 7th July, 1838, 29th July, 1850, and 6th May, 1864.

sole owner of the Canal Boat vessel called the Mary C. Covell of Buffalo whereof he is at present Master, and as he hath sworn is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Canal Boat vessel was built at Vienna, N. Y. in the year 1866, as appears by the Certificate of Geo. H. Covell, Shipwright her builder, dated August 8, 1866, on file in this office

And A. H. Scriven, Surveyor having certified that the said Canal Boat or vessel has on deck and no mast, and that her length is 94 feet, her breadth 17 feet, her depth 8 feet, her height 10 feet, and that she measures 115 tons and 12 hundredths,
