Y. in the year 1866, as appears by the Certificate of Frank McBlanathan, Shipwright her builder, on file in this Office.

And A. H. Scriven, Surveyor, having certified that the said Canal Boat or vessel has one deck and no mast, and that her length is 95 feet, her breadth 17 feet, her depth 8 feet, her height 10 feet, and that she measures 109 - tons and - 87 - hundredths,
