Y. in the year 1865 as appears by the Certificate of A. H. Koller, Shipwright, her builder on file in this office

And A. H. Scriven, Surveyor, having certified that the said Canal Boat or vessel has one deck and no mast, and that her length is 95 feet, her breadth 17 feet, her depth 9 feet, her height 10 feet, and that she measures 124.74 tons and 74 hundredths,
