Y. in the year 1862, as appears by the Certificate of E. K. Miley, Shipwright, her builder, dated August 1, 1865, on file in this Office.

And A. H. Scriven, Surveyor, having certified that the said Canal Boat or vessel has one deck and no mast, and that her length is 95 feet, her breadth 17 feet, her depth 8 feet, her height 52 feet, and that she measures 111 - tons and 75 - hundredths,
