In Conformity, to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for enrolling and Licensing Ships or Vessels, &c." passed the 18th Feb. 1793, and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 17th June, 1864, and the Acts of the 7th July, 1838, 29th July, 1850, and 6th May, 1864.

Asa Ransom, Jr.

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he resides at Grand Island, N. Y. and owns (1/5) one fifth, and that Asa Ransom, Levant Ransom, Harry B. Ransom, and James J. Ransom, reside at the same place, and each owns (1/5) one fifth, and that they are

sole owners of the <sup>Boat</sup> Scow Canal, or vessel called the "Charles Henry" of Grand Island whereof "Charles Henry" is at present Master, and as he hath sworn is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Scow Canal or vessel was built at Grand Island, N. Y. in the year 1866, as appears by the Certificate of Asa Ransom Jr. Shipwright, her builder, on file in this Office.

And A. H. Scriven, Surveyor, having certified that the said Scow Canal <sup>Boat</sup> vessel has one deck and no mast, and that her length is 90 feet, her breadth 17 1/2 feet, her depth 5 1/2 feet, her height 10 feet, and that she measures - 71 - tons and 60 - hundredths,
