In Conformity, to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for enrolling and Licensing Ships or Vessels, &c." passed the 18th Feb. 1793, and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 17th June, 1864, and the Acts of the 7th July, 1838, 29th July, 1850, and 6th May, 1864.

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he resides at Buffalo, N. Y. and owns one third (1/3) and that George Maytham resides at the same place, and owns one third (1/3) and that Thomas Maytham resides at Cleveland, Ohio and owns the remaining one third (1/3) and that they are Citizens of the United States, sole owners of the Tug Prop or vessel called the "A. M. Ball" of Buffalo whereof John Johnson is at present Master, and as he hath sworn is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Tug Prop or vessel was built at Buffalo, N. Y. in the year 1864, as appears by the Certificate of her last Enrollment, at this port dated March 21, 1866, and numbered 28, now surrendered having changed owners.

And said Enrollment, having certified that the said Tug Propeller or vessel has one deck and no mast, and that her length is 48 feet, her breadth 13 feet, her depth 6 feet, her height 10 feet, and that she measures 19 tons and 08 hundredths,
