In Conformity, to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for enrolling and Licensing Ships or Vessels, &c." passed the 18th Feb. 1793, and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 17th June, 1864, and the Acts of the 7th July, 1838, 29th July, 1850, and 6th May, 1864.

is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Schooner or vessel was built at Montreal. This in the year 1854, as appears by the Certificate of her last Enrollment, at the port of Dunkirk, N. Y. dated August 4, 1866, and numbered 16, now surrendered having changed Districts and said Enrollment.

And said Enrollment. having certified that and the said Schooner or vessel has one deck and two masts and Owner that her length is 109 feet, her breadth 24 feet, her depth 9 feet, her height 1 foot, and that she measures 176 - tons and 79 hundredths,
