Y. in the year 1864, as appears by the Certificate of E. C. Stark, shipwright her builder, dated Dec 26, 1866, on file in this Office.

And Sanford Halbert, surveyor, having certified that the said Canal Boat or vessel has One deck and No mast, and that her length is 95 feet, her breadth 17 feet, her depth 7 feet, her height 10 feet, and that she measures 104 tons and 75 hundredths,
