is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Schooner or vessel was built at Buffalo, N. Y. in the year 1867, as appears by the Certificate of H. J. Williams, shipwright, her builder, on file in this Office, dated March 26, 1867.

And Alonzo H. Scriven, Surveyor, having certified that the said Schooner or vessel has One deck and two masts and that her length is 139 feet, her breadth 31 feet, her depth 10 feet, her height 10 feet, and that she measures 363 - tons and 50 - hundredths,
