is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Steam Tugboat vessel was built at Buffalo, N. Y. in the year 1865, as appears by the Certificate of C. A. Van Slyke, shipwright, her builder, dated April 2, 1867, On file in this Office.

And George H. Scriven, Surveyor having certified that the said Steam Tugboat or vessel has One deck and no masts and that her length is 50 feet, her breadth 8 feet, her depth 2 feet, her height 10 feet, and that she measures 12 tons and 49 hundredths,
