In Conformity, to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for enrolling and Licensing Ships or Vessels, &c." passed the 18th Feb. 1793, and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 17th June, 1864, and the Acts of the 7th July, 1838, 29th July, 1850, and 6th May, 1864.

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he resides at Buffalo, N. Y. and jointly with James G. Evans under the firm of J. G. & E. J. Evans, own Four sevenths (4/7), and that James G. Evans resides at the same place, and own One seventh (1/7) & that Gibson & Chase reside at Chicago, Ill. and own the remaining Two sevenths (2/7) & that they are Citizens of the United States & sole owners of the Propeller or vessel called the "Queen of the Lakes" of Buffalo whereof Charles M. Bellows is at present Master, and as he hath sworn

is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Propeller or vessel was built at Black River, Wis. in the year 1853, as appears by the Certificate of her last Enrollment at this Port, dated May 9, 1865, and numbered 132. And surrendered having changed Owners.

And said Enrollment, having certified that the said Propeller or vessel has two deck and one mast, and that her length is 184 feet, her breadth 26 feet, her depth 10 feet, her height 42 feet, and that she measures 637 tons and 84 hundredths,
