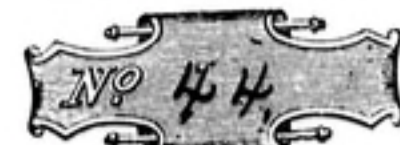

In Conformity, to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for enrolling and Licensing Ships or Vessels, &c." passed the 18th Feb. 1793, and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 17th June, 1864, and the Acts of the 7th July, 1838, 29th July, 1850, and 6th May, 1864.

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he resides at Buffalo, N. Y. and that H. D. Talcott resides at Silver Creek, N. Y. and that they are

(each one half part) Citizens of the United States sole owners of the Schooner or vessel called the L. J. Farwell of Buffalo whereof J. F. Reed is at present Master, and as he hath sworn

is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Schooner or vessel was built at Black River, N. Y. in the year 1856, as appears by the Certificate of her last Enrollment at this Port, dated February 25, 1867, and numbered 8, now surrendered having changed Owners, and said Enrollment, having certified that

the said Schooner or vessel has One deck and two masts, and that her length is 130 feet, her breadth 25 feet, her depth 10 feet, her height 10 feet, and that she measures 265 tons and 25 hundredths,
