Y. in the year 1867, as appears by the Certificate of John Martel, shipwright her builder, dated April 22, 1867. On file in this Office.

And Alonzo H. Scriven, surveyor, having certified that the said Barque or vessel has the deck and the masts and that her length is 155 feet, her breadth 21 feet, her depth 12 feet, her height 10 feet, and that she measures 420 tons and 28 hundredths,
