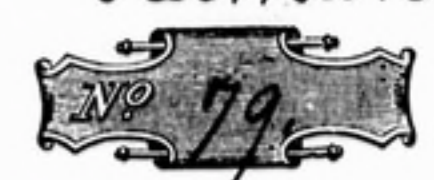

In Conformity, to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for enrolling and Licensing Ships or Vessels, &c." passed the 18th Feb. 1793, and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 17th June, 1864, and the Acts of the 7th July, 1838, 29th July, 1850, and 6th May, 1864.

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he resides at Buffalo, N. Y., and that he is a

Citizen of the United States
sole owner of the Propeller or vessel called the Clepe

of Buffalo whereof is at present Master, and as he hath sworn is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Propeller or vessel was built at Buffalo, N. Y., in the year 1857, as appears by the Certificate of her last Enrollment, at this Port, dated Sept 12, 1865, and numbered 224.

Now surrendered having changed Owners And said Enrollment having certified that

the said Propeller or vessel has two decks and one mast, and that her length is 182, 6/10 feet, her breadth 21, 0/10 feet, her depth 10, 5/10 feet, her height 10, 10/10 feet, and that she measures 887.42 tons and 42, 1/100 hundredths,
