is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Canal Boat or vessel was built at Rochester, N. Y. in the year 1866 as appears by the Certificate of H. B. Knapp, shipwright, her builder, dated March 14, 1867. On file in this Office.

And Alonzo H. Scriven, Surveyor having certified that the said Canal Boat or vessel has One deck and no mast, and that her length is 95 feet, her breadth 17 feet, her depth 8 feet, her height 10 feet, and that she measures 123 tons and 16 hundredths,
