In Conformity, to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for enrolling and Licensing Ships or Vessels, &c." passed the 18th Feb. 1793, and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 17th June, 1864, and the Acts of the 7th July, 1838, 29th July, 1850, and 6th May, 1864.

William Chappell
having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he resides at Buffalo, N. Y. and that Henry Millring resides at the same place and that they are

sole owners of the Scow Schooner vessel called the Maria Rahill

is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Scow Schooner vessel

certificate of William Chappell, shipwright,
her builder, dated May 21, 1867. On file
