sole owners of the Sug Prop vessel called the Leviathan of Buffalo whereof G. H. Rounds is at present Master, and as he hath sworn

is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Sug Prop or vessel was built at Buffalo, N. Y. in the year 1857, as appears by the Certificate of her last Enrollment at this Port, dated Sept 14, 1865 and numbered 235.
