In Conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for enrolling and Licensing Ships or Vessels, &c." passed the 18th Feb. 1793, and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 17th June, 1864, and the Acts of the 7th July, 1838, 29th July, 1850, and 6th May, 1864,

William R. Campbell, having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he resides at Deper, Wis, and that Andrew Reid resides at the same place, and that they are

is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Brig or vessel was built at Cleveland, O in the year 1848, as appears by the Certificate of her last Enrollment at the Port of Milwaukee. It is dated April 21, 1866, and is now surrendered, license having expired while out of home District

And said Enrollments having certified that the said Brig or vessel has one deck and two masts and that her length is 112 feet her breadth 22 feet her depth 8 feet her height 10 feet and that she measures 165 tons and 17 hundredths,
