sole owners of the Canal Boat vessel called the Billy Lake of Buffalo whereof Judson Field is at present Master, and as he hath sworn is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Canal Boat vessel was built at Buffalo, N. Y. in the year 1864, as appears by the Certificate of Geo. H. Koster, shipwright her builder, dated July 14, 1868. On file in this Office.

And Monro H. Leiven, Surveyor having certified that the said Canal Boat vessel has One deck and No mast, and that her length is 95 feet her breadth 17 feet her depth 8 feet her height 10 feet and that she measures 123 tons and 26 hundredths,
