each one third (3 parts) Citizens of the United States sole owners of the Steam Sacht vessel called the Gattie L. Brown of Buffalo whereof James Kerr is at present Master, and as he hath sworn is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Steam Sacht vessel was built at Buffalo, N. Y. in the year 1865, as appears by the Certificate of R. J. Cooper, shipwright her builder, dated Sept 3rd 1868. On file in this Office.

And George H. Scriven, Surveyor, having certified that the said Steam Sacht or vessel has One deck and No mast, and that her length is 37 feet her breadth 7 feet her depth 2 feet her height 10 feet and that she measures Seven tons and Seventy hundredths,
