Y. in the year 1862, as appears by the Certificate of her last Enrollment at this Port, dated Nov 2. 1868. and Numbered 91.

Now surrendered having changed Owner and said Enrollment having certified that the said Canal Boat or vessel has One deck and No mast, and that her length is 94 feet her breadth 17 feet her depth 8 feet her height 10 feet and that she measures 118 tons and 09 hundredths,
