In Conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for enrolling and Licensing Ships or Vessels, &c." passed the 18th Feb. 1793, and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 17th June, 1804, and the Acts of the 7th July, 1838, 29th July, 1850, and 6th May, 1864,

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he resides at Buffalo, N. Y., and that Mr. H. C. Lape resided at the same place, and that they are

(each one half part) Citizens of the United States sole owners of the Canal Boat vessel called the Seneca of Buffalo whereof Judson Field is at present Master, and as he hath sworn is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Canal Boat vessel was built at Saraca, N. Y. in the year 1868, as appears by the Certificate of B. F. Baber, Shipwright per builder, dated October 22, 1868. On file in this Office.

And Alonso H. Scribn Surveyor having certified that the said Canal Boat or vessel has one deck and no mast, and that her length is 94 feet her breadth 17 feet her depth 8 feet her height 10 feet and that she measures 122 tons and 25 hundredths,
