Y. the year 1867, as appears by the Certificate of her last Enrollment at this Port, dated April 2, 1868 and Numbered 249.

Now surrendered having changed Owners. And said Enrollment Having certified that the said Barge or vessel has One deck and Two masts and that her length is 194 ⁷/₁₀ feet her breadth 30 ⁸/₁₀ feet her depth 11 ¹⁰/₁₀ feet and that she measures 534 tons and 24 hundredths,
