Enrollment in conformity to an Act of the Congress of the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA entitled "An Act for enrolling and licensing SHIPS OR VESSELS, &c." passed 18th February, 1793, and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 17th June, 1864, and the Acts of the 7th July, 1838, 29th July, 1850, and 6th May, 1864.

said Brig or Vessel was built at Euclid, Ohio in the year 1854 as appears by the temporary enrolment issued at the Port of Chicago, Ill. dated April 7, 1870, numbered 161.

Now surrendered, vessel having arrived at her home port.

And said Enrolment having certified that the said Brig or Vessel has One Deck and two Masts and that

her length is 128 feet,

her breadth is 29 feet,

her depth 11 feet,

her height 10 feet,

and that she measures 221 Tons and 96 hundredths, viz:
