IN CONFORMITY to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships or Vessels," &c., passed the 18th February, 1793, and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and the Acts of the 7th July, 1838, 29th July, 1850, 6th May, 1864, and 17th June, 1864.

John Helderhouse of Buffalo, N.Y. having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he is a

citizen of the United States, and sole owner of the Schooner or vessel called the Evening Star, of Buffalo, whereof he is at present Master, and as he hath sworn that he is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Schooner or vessel was built at East Saginaw, Mich. in the year 1844 as appears by the Certificate of J. M. Brothwaite, shipwright her builder, on file in this Office. And Alexander Ferguson, Surveyor, East Saginaw, Mich. having certified that the said Schooner or vessel has one deck and three masts, and that her length is 180 feet, her breadth 33 feet, her depth 12 feet, her height 10 feet; that she measures 497 tons and 81 hundredths, viz.:
