In Conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships or Vessels," &c., passed the 18th February, 1793, and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and the Acts of the 7th July, 1838, 29th July, 1850, 6th May, 1864, and 17th June, 1864.

Hiram H. Smith of Buffalo <sup>N.Y.</sup> having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he, together with is Attorney of Mildred Smith who resides at the same place, and owns Three fourths (3/4), and that Samuel Q. Kelderhouse resides at the same place, and owns One fourth (1/4), and that they are

sole owners of the Brig or vessel called the Helfenstein of Buffalo whereof Charles Gilbert is at present Master, and as he hath sworn that he is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Brig or vessel was built at Milwaukee, Wis. in the year 1844, as appears by the Certificate of her last Enrolment at this Port, dated April 6, 1869, & numbered 130. Now surrendered having changed owners. And said Enrolment, having certified that the

said Brig or vessel has One deck and two masts, and that her length is 130 feet, her breadth 26 feet, her depth 12 feet, her height 10 feet, and that she measures 281 tons and 40 hundredths, viz:

Smith, having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given, in conformity with the terms of the said Acts, the said Brig has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N. Y.
