States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and the Acts of the 7th July, 1838, 29th July, 1850, 6th May, 1864, and 17th June, 1864.

Samuel S Watson of Buffalo N.Y. having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he, together with he is a

citizen of the United States, and sole owner of the Schooner or vessel called the Newsboy of Buffalo whereof James M. Coleman is at present Master, and as he hath sworn that he is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Schooner or vessel was built at East Saginaw Mich. in the year 1862, as appears by her last Enrollment at this Port dated Sept 6 1869 & numbered 56 now surrendered having changed owners And said Enrollment having certified that the

said Schooner or vessel has one deck and three masts, and that her length is 152 feet, her breadth 31 feet, her depth 12 feet, her height — feet, and that she measures 432 tons and 42 hundredths, viz:

That she is a Schooner has an Eagle Figure head, and a Square stern. And the said Samuel S Watson having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given, in conformity with the terms of the said Acts, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo N.Y.
