In Conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships or Vessels," &c., passed the 18th February, 1793, and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and the Acts of the 7th July, 1838, 29th July, 1850, 6th May, 1864, and 17th June, 1864.

Mercurius Dimick of Buffalo, N.Y. having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he, ~~together with~~ it a

sole owner of the Schooner or vessel called the Lardinia of Buffalo whereof Lorenzo Dimick is at present Master, and as he hath sworn that he is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Schooner or vessel was built at Detroit which is a citizen of the United States, in the year 1860, as appears by the Certificate of her last Enrolment at that Port, dated April 16, 1870 numbered 126 now surrendered having changed Owners. And said Enrolment having certified that the said Schooner or vessel has One deck and three masts, and that her length is 140 feet, her breadth 26 feet, her depth 12 feet, her height 10 feet, and that she measures 222 tons and 96 hundredths, viz:

That she is a Schooner has no figure head, and a square stern. And the said Mercurius Dimick having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given, in conformity with the terms of the said Acts, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N.Y.
