In Conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships or Vessels," &c., passed the 18th February, 1793, and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and the Acts of the 7th July, 1838, 29th July, 1850, 6th May, 1864, and 17th June, 1864.

Henry C. Kinslow of Buffalo, N. Y. having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he, together with his attorney of H. J. Kinslow of New York, who owns three fourths (3/4), and that R. K. Kinslow of Cleveland, Ohio owns one fourth (1/4), and that they are

citizens of the United States, and sole owners of the Schooner or vessel called the Delaware of Buffalo, whereof James P. Cotton is at present Master, and as he hath sworn that he is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Schooner or vessel was built at Detroit, Mich. in the year 1848, as appears by the Certificate of her last Enrolment at the Port, dated April 16, 1868, numbered 39, now surrendered having changed Owner & District. And said Enrolment

having certified that the said Schooner or vessel has one deck and three masts, and that her length is 172 feet, her breadth 30 feet, her depth 13 feet, her height 10 feet, and that she measures 546 tons and 69 hundredths, viz:
