Y. in the year 1856, as appears by the Certificate of her last Enrolment at this Port, dated March 22, 1870, numbered 115. Now surrendered having changed Owners. And said Enrolment having certified that the

said Brig or vessel has One deck and two masts, and that her length is 116 feet, her breadth 24 feet, her depth 10 feet, her height 10 feet, and that she measures 203 tons and 05 hundredths, viz:
