In Conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships or Vessels," &c., passed the 18th February, 1793, and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and the Acts of the 7th July, 1838, 29th July, 1850, 6th May, 1864, and 17th June, 1864.

Henry C. Kinslow of Buffalo, N.Y. having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he, together with his attorney of H. J. Kinslow of New York, who owns Three Eighths (3/8), and R. K. Kinslow of Cleveland, Ohio owns Three Eighths (3/8), and that J. M. Smith of Mentor, Ohio owns Two Eighths (2/8), and that they are

sole owner of the Schooner or vessel called the Samuel P. Ely of Buffalo whereof Edward Fiske is at present Master, and as he hath sworn that he is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Schooner or vessel was built at Detroit, Mich. in the year 1859, as appears by the Certificate of her last Enrolment at this Port, dated April 16, 1870, & numbered 138. Now surrendered having changed owner. And said Enrolment having certified that the

said Schooner or vessel has One deck and three masts, and that her length is 200 feet, her breadth 21 feet, her depth 13 feet, her height 10 feet, and that she measures 627 tons and 24 hundredths, viz:

That she is a Schooner has a plain head, and a square stern. And the said Henry C. Kinslow having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given, in conformity with the terms of the said Acts, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N.Y.
