In Conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships or Vessels," &c., passed the 18th February, 1793, and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and the Acts of the 7th July, 1838, 29th July, 1850, 6th May, 1864, and 17th June, 1864.

Harriet R. Watson of Buffalo, N.Y. having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that she, together with

sole owner of the Schooner or vessel called the Levi Rawson of Buffalo whereof John Baxter is at present Master, and as he hath sworn that he is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Schooner or vessel was built at Black River Ohio in the year 1861, as appears by her Temporary Enrolment at the Port of Chicago, Ill. dated May 5, 1841, numbered 175. Now surrendered having arrived at Long Point, and altered from a Barge to Schooner rig. And said Enrolment having certified that the said Schooner or vessel has one deck and three masts, and that her length is 144 feet, her breadth 30 feet, her depth 11 feet, her height 10 feet, and that she measures 361 tons and 48 hundredths, viz:

That she is a Schooner has a plain head, and a square stern. And the said Harriet R. Watson having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given, in conformity with the terms of the said Acts, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N.Y.

Given under my hand and seal of the Port of Buffalo, N.Y. in the District of Buffalo Creek this 22nd day of May in the year one thousand eight hundred and Seventy one.
