In Conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships or Vessels," &c., passed the 18th February, 1793, and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and the Acts of the 7th July, 1838, 29th July, 1850, 6th May, 1864, and 17th June, 1864.

J. S. Munderback of Buffalo, N. Y. having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he, together with

sole owner of the Canal Boat or vessel called the Shamrock of Buffalo whereof he is at present Master. and as he hath sworn that he is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Canal Boat or vessel was built at Rochester, N. Y. in the year 1866, as appears by her Enrolment at this Port, dated Nov. 9, 1866 & numbered 298. The Certificate of which has been lost as appeared by the affidavit of J. S. Munderback, On file in this Office. And said Enrolment having certified that the said Canal Boat or vessel has One deck and one mast, and that her length is 95 feet, her breadth 17 feet, her depth 11 feet, her height 10 feet, and that she measures 152 tons and 72 hundredths, viz:

That she is a Canal Boat has a plain head, and a round stern. And the said J. S. Munderback having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given, in conformity with the terms of the said Acts, the said Canal Boat has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N. Y.
