Buffalo, N.Y. taken or subscribed the Oath that he, together with

sole owners of the Canal Boat or vessel called the Frankie Burch of Buffalo whereof Frederick Trapp is at present Master, and as he hath sworn that he is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Canal Boat or vessel was built at Tonawanda, N.Y. in the year 1871, as appears by the Certificate of Parsons & Humble shipwrights her builders. On file in this Office.

Alonzo B. Scriven, Surveyor said Canal Boat or vessel has One deck and one mast, and that her length is 94 feet, her breadth 17 feet, her depth 7 feet, her height 10 feet, and that she measures 115 tons, viz:

That she is a Canal Boat has a plain head, and a square stern. And the said Frederick Trapp having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given, in conformity with the terms of the said Acts, the said Canal Boat has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N.Y.
