United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and the Acts of the 7th July, 1838, 29th July, 1850, 6th May, 1864, and 17th June, 1864.

George I. Bentley of Buffalo, N. Y. having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he, together with his Attorney of Jesse Hoyt of New York, who is a

citizen of the United States, and sole owner of the Schooner or vessel called the H. C. Potter of Buffalo whereof George I. Bentley is at present Master, and as he hath sworn that he is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Schooner or vessel was built at East Saginaw, Mich. in the year 1868, as appears by the Certificate of her last Enrolment at this Port, dated May 6. 1870. numbered 165. Now surrendered having changed Owners. And said Enrolment having certified that the

said Schooner or vessel has One deck and two masts, and that her length is 120 feet, her breadth 30 feet, her depth 10 feet, her height 10 feet, and that she measures 209 tons and 27 hundredths, viz:

That she is a Schooner has a figure head, and a square stern. And the said George I. Bentley having agreed to the description and admasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given, in conformity with the terms of the said Acts, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N. Y.
