In Conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships or Vessels," &c., passed the 18th February, 1793, and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and the Acts of the 7th July, 1838, 29th July, 1850, 6th May, 1864, and 17th June, 1864.

Robert Anderson of Buffalo, N.Y. having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he, together with own Ten Sixteenths (10/16), and that Mrs. Mary A. Bruce of the same place, owns Five Sixteenths (5/16) and that David Mc. Cormack of the same place, owns One Sixteenth (1/16), and are

citizens of the United States, and sole owners of the Schooner or vessel called the **Champion** of Buffalo, whereof David Mc. Cormack is at present Master, and as he hath sworn that he is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Schooner or vessel was built at Cleveland, Ohio in the year 1862, as appears by the Certificate of her last Enrolment at this Port, dated March 28, 1871, numbered 117. Now surrendered having changed Owners. And said Enrolment

said Schooner or vessel has One deck and three masts, and that her length is 182 feet, her breadth 33 feet, her depth 13 feet, her height 10 feet, and that she measures 585 tons and 59 hundredths, viz:

That she is a Schooner has a plain head, and a square stern. And the said Robert Anderson having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given, in conformity with the terms of the said Acts, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N.Y.
