In Conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships or Vessels," &c., passed the 18th February, 1793, and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and the Acts of the 7th July, 1838, 29th July, 1850, 6th May, 1864, and 17th June, 1864.

H. C. Kinslow of Buffalo, N.Y. having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he, together with is Attorney of H. J. Kinslow of New York, who owns One half (1/2) and that R. K. Kinslow of Cleveland, Ohio owns Three Eighths (3/8) and that Mrs. H. Jones of the same place, owns One Eighth (1/8), and that they are

citizens of the United States, and sole owners of the Schooner or vessel called the King Fisher of Buffalo, whereof Henry C. Kinslow is at present Master, and as he hath sworn that he is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Schooner or vessel was built at Cleveland, Ohio in the year 1864, as appears by the Certificate of her last Enrolment at this Port, dated May 17, 1869, numbered 234. Now surrendered having changed Owners and said Enrolment

having certified that the said Schooner or vessel has One deck and three masts, and that her length is 165 feet, her breadth 32 feet, her depth 12 feet, her height 10 feet, and that she measures 517 tons and 32 hundredths, viz:

Kinslow having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given, in conformity with the terms of the said Acts, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N.Y.
