In Conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships or Vessels," &c., passed the 18th February, 1793, and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and the Acts of the 7th July, 1838, 29th July, 1850, 6th May, 1864, and 17th June, 1864.

Phil S. Bemis of Buffalo, N. Y. having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he, ~~together with~~ owns Three tenths ( $\frac{3}{10}$ ), and that Thomas Burch of the same place, owns One fifth ( $\frac{1}{5}$ ), and that Geo. A. Bemis of the same place, owns One half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ), and that they are

sole owners of the Schooner or vessel called the C. N. Johnson, of Buffalo, N. Y. whereof Thomas Burch is at present Master. and as he hath sworn that he is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Schooner or vessel was built at Buffalo, N. Y. in the year 1856, as appears by the Certificate of her last Enrollment at this Port, dated April 28, 1870, numbered 152, now surrendered having changed Owner. And said Enrollment having certified that the

said Schooner or vessel has One deck and two masts, and that her length is 138 feet, her breadth 26 feet, her depth 10 feet, her height 10 feet, and that she measures 288 tons and 24 hundredths, viz:

That she is a Schooner has a plain head, and a square stern. And the said Phil S. Bemis, having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given, in conformity with the terms of the said Acts, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N.
