In Conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships or Vessels," &c., passed the 18th February, 1793, and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and the Acts of the 7th July, 1838, 29th July, 1850, 6th May, 1864, and 17th June, 1864.

Edward Smith of Buffalo, N.Y. having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he, together with M. M. McEwen, of the same place, and Herman H. Korden of Kirkville, Onondaga Co., N.Y., are

(each one third) sole owners of the Schooner or vessel called the Young America of Buffalo, whereof F. E. Bateman is at present Master, and as he hath sworn that he is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Schooner or vessel was built at Buffalo, N.Y. in the year 1853, as appears by the Certificate of her last Enrollment at this Port, dated April 19, 1872, numbered 113, now surrendered having changed Owners And said Enrollment

having certified that the said Schooner or vessel has One deck and two masts, and that her length is 129 feet, her breadth 25 feet, her depth 10 feet, her height 10 feet, and that she measures 242 tons and 99 hundredths, viz:

That she is a Schooner has a plain head, and a square stern. And the said Edward Smith having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given, in conformity with the terms of the said Acts, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N.Y.
