United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and the 5th May, 1864, and 17th June, 1864.

Buffalo N.Y. having taken or subscribed the Oath that he, together with the crew of the same vessel are

each own half (1/2) sole owners of the Schooner or vessel called the Carlingford of Buffalo whereof J. A. Morrison is at present Master, and is he hath sworn that he is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Schooner or vessel was built at Port Huron Michigan in the year 1869, as appears by her last registration at the Port of Port Huron Mich. dated April 4. 1872 and Number 2. Now surrendered vessel having arrived at her Home Port. And said Registrar having certified that the

said Schooner or vessel has one deck and three masts, and that her length is 154 feet, <sup>7</sup>/<sub>10</sub> feet, her breadth 31 feet, <sup>1</sup>/<sub>10</sub> feet, her depth 12 feet, <sup>3</sup>/<sub>10</sub> feet, her height 10 feet, <sup>10</sup>/<sub>10</sub> feet, and that she measures 471 tons and 41 hundredths, viz:
