In Conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships or Vessels," &c., passed the 18th February, 1793, and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and the Acts of the 7th July, 1838, 29th July, 1850, 6th May, 1864, and 17th June, 1864,

Chandler J. Kells of Buffalo, N.Y. having taken or subscribed the Oath
 required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he, together with
 Isaac Holloway of the same place, are

(each one half 1/2) sole-owners of the Barge or vessel called the Point Stone of Buffalo whereof John Adams is at present Master, and as he hath sworn that he is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Barge or vessel was built at Buffalo, N.Y. in the year 1872, as appears by the Certificate of Geo. H. Katter, Shipwright her builder, On file in this Office.

And George H. Lemen having certified that the said Barge or vessel has One deck and No mast, and that her length is 112 feet, her breadth 22 feet, her depth 7 feet, her height 10 feet, and that she measures 148 tons and 97 hundredths, viz:

That she is a Barge has a plain head, and a square stern. And the said Chandler J. Kells having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given, in conformity with the terms of the said Acts, the said Barge has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N.Y.
