In Conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships or Vessels," &c., passed the 18th February, 1793, and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and the Acts of the 7th July, 1838, 29th July, 1850, 6th May, 1864, and 17th June, 1864.

J. I. Kunderback of Buffalo, N.Y. having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he, together with it a

sole owner of the Canal Boat vessel called the Buffalo whereof J. I. Pease is at present Master, and as he hath sworn that he is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Canal Boat vessel was built at Rochester, N.Y. in the year 1842, as appears by the Certificate of C. C. Meyer, Shipwright her builder. On file in this Office.

Alonso H. Scriven, Surveyor said Canal Boat vessel has One deck and one mast, and that her length is 95 feet, her breadth 17 feet, her depth 11 feet, her height 10 feet, and that she measures 153 tons and 41 hundredths, viz:

That she is a Canal Boat has a plain head, and a square stern. And the said J. I. Kunderback having agreed to the description and admasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given, in conformity with the terms of the said Acts, the said Canal Boat has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N.Y.
