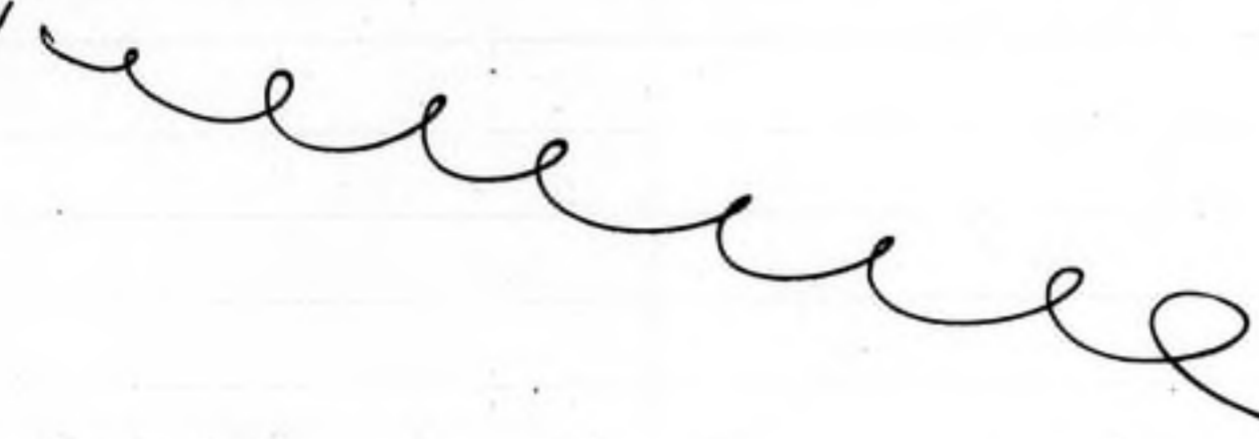


ENROLMENT No. 171,

Permanent.

In Conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships or Vessels," &c., passed the 18th February, 1793, and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and the Acts of the 7th July, 1838, 29th July, 1850, 6th May, 1864, and 17th June, 1864.

Justus Tremain of Buffalo, N.Y. having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he, together with it as



sole owner of the Canal Boat or vessel called the Buffalo whereof he is present Master. and as he hath sworn that he is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Canal Boat or vessel was built at Middleport, N.Y. in the year 1872, as appears by the Certificate of Duntov & King, Shipwrights her builders. On file in the Office

George H. Green, Surveyor. And having certified that the said Canal Boat or vessel has one deck and no mast, and that her length is 96.14 feet, her breadth 10 feet, her depth 6 feet, her height 10 feet, and that she measures 116 tons and 40 hundredths, viz:

That she is a Canal Boat has a plain head, and a round stern. And the said Justus Tremain having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given, in conformity with the terms of the said Acts, the said Canal Boat has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N.Y.
