Permanent.

In Conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships or Vessels," &c., passed the 18th February, 1793, and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and the Acts of the 7th July, 1838, 29th July, 1850, 6th May, 1864, and 17th June, 1864.

Thomas Banfield of Buffalo, N.Y. having taken or subscribed the Oath, required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he, together with Francis Sullivan of the same place, are

citizens of the United States, and sole owners of the Canal Boat or vessel called the Peter V. Carroll of Buffalo whereof Francis Sullivan is at present Master, and as he hath sworn that he is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Canal Boat or vessel was built at Cleveland, N.Y. in the year 1840, as appears by the Certificate of her last Enrolment at the Port of New York, dated April 1, 1872, numbered 573, from surrendered having changed Owner. And said Enrolment

having certified that the said Canal Boat or vessel has One deck, and Sq. mast, and that her length is 95 feet, her breadth 17.8 feet, her depth 10 feet, her height 10 feet, and that she measures 118 tons and 32 hundredths, viz:

That she is a Canal Boat has no head, and a square stern. And the said Thomas Banfield having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given, in conformity with the terms of the said Acts, the said Canal Boat has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N.Y.
